Signs of Alcoholism



- ⇒ Greater Tolerance for drinking (Drinking more without getting drunk)
- ⇒ Loss of control over your drinking
- ⇒ Wish to quit but can't
- ⇒ Given up other activities to drink.
- ⇒ Drinking even when it causing problems with your personal life and relationships
- ⇒ Drinking in the morning, are often drunk for long periods of time or drinking alone
- ⇒ You feel guilty after drinking
- ⇒ Weight loss
- ⇒ You feel the need to make excuses for the amount you drink

Withdrawal symptoms such as:

- \Rightarrow Anxiety
- ⇒ Shakiness and Sweating
- ⇒ Nausea and Vomiting
- ⇒ Insomnia and Irritability
- \Rightarrow Depression
- ⇒ Fatigue and loss of appetite
- ⇒ Headaches

In severe cases you may suffer from:

- ⇒ Hallucinations
- ⇒ Confusion
- ⇒ Seizures
- ⇒ Fever
- ⇒ Agitation







The Services we Offer

We have a range of services available for service users that are listed below:

Helpline

This is available during opening hours.

Advice and Information

Staff members can provide specific or general information in relation to alcohol and its effects

Counselling

Following assessment customised brief or extended counselling programmes are offered. These include brief interventions, motivational interviewing, cognitive behaviour therapy, solution-focussed therapy.

Appointments can usually be offered within a short period of time.

Consultation

We can act as a resource for other caring professionals, providing information and advice on developing a care package for individual clients.

Availability:

This service is available to anyone

Additional Services We offer

Employee Referral Service

Policy development and training

RCA Trust can provide assistance to employers who wish to establish or update their alcohol, substance misuse gambling policies. We can also offer training to appropriate personnel on how alcohol or recognise these problems in the workplace and how to deal with them.

Counselling

We also offer assessment and counselling services for employees referred by companies for alcohol-related problems that impact on their work performance or as part of a welfare policy.

This is a confidential service that balances the confidentiality of the employee while assisting employers to help him/her deal successfully with the problem. Counselling is normally offered for a fixed period in the first instance.

Availability:

This service is available to any agency, organisation or company.

Offender Services

Assessment and counselling

Our dedicated staff can provide assessments and counselling services for offenders with alcohol-related problems. Counselling is normally offered for a fixed period in the first instance.

Availability:

This service can only accept clients referred by social work, courts or procurator fiscal. Assessments can be provided for defence lawyers.







